19 members. Also, due to the dire economic times of the State budget, there is an

26 In the appropriations bill, it states the transfer amount of \$454,000 to the
27 department of education to be used for the beginning teacher mentoring and
28 induction program.

30 Dr. Maurer and Beth Myers attended the State Records Committee meeting and the
31 committee agreed that all documents coming in can be shredded after 5-6 months.
32 All documents we receive are scanned into VI and can be reproduced.

1 Dr. Maurer also thanked the departing board members and enjoyed working with
2 them for the past 4 ½ years and wished them the best in their future educational
3 pursuits.
