

1 Merle Johnson moved, with a second by Laura Stevens, that in **case number 10-**
2 **59**, the Board accepts the Respondent's waiver of hearing and voluntary surrender
3 and that the Board issue an order permanently revoking the Respondent's license
4 with no possibility of reinstatement. Roll call vote: Almanza-yes, Duehr-yes,
5 Fangman-yes, Johnson-yes, Robinson-yes, Smith-yes, Stevens-yes, Trueg-yes,
6 Wortmann-yes. **MOTION CARRIED.**

8 Greg Robinson moved, with a second by Julio Almanza, that in **case number 10-**
9 **09, In the Matter of Brian Rodemeyer**, the Board accepts the proposed decision
10 but changes the last paragraph on page 10, line three to read "suspended for a
11 period of eight months. In addition, the Respondent shall be required to take an
12 ethics course including necessary professional issues of licensure." For the
13 following reasons: as noted on page 9, the third paragraph, "The preponderance of
14 the evidence established that Respondent violated 282 IAC 25.3(5)(a)(5) and
15 25.3(6)(m) and (o) when he executed a written professional employment contract to
16 perform the duties of the superintendent for Ventura Community School District
17 and when he assumed and performed the duties of superintendent when he did not
18 have the required licensure. Respondent admits that he signed a contract to
19 perform the duties as superintendent and further admits that he performed the
20 duties of a superintendent for approximately seven months when he did not have
21 the appropriate licensure." The sanction proposed is not in line with the
22 expectations of our education community nor of the accountability required in our
23 profession especially of the administrator assigned to lead this organization. Roll
24 call vote: Almanza-yes, Duehr-yes, Fangman-yes, Johnson-yes, Robinson-yes,
25 Smith-yes, Stevens-yes, Trueg-yes, Wortmann-yes. **MOTION CARRIED.** (Dr.
26 Maurer, Executive Director and Beth Myers, Attorney/Investigator, left the room
27 during the discussion of this case.)

29 Greg Robinson moved, with a second by Merle Johnson, that in **case number 09-**
30 **45**, the Board delegate authority to the Administrative Law Judge to decide on the
31 Motion to Lift Protective Order. Roll call vote: Almanza-yes, Duehr-yes, Fangman-
32 yes, Johnson-yes, Robinson-yes, Smith-yes, Stevens-yes, Trueg-yes, Wortmann-
33 yes. **MOTION CARRIED.**
